I Catharine Marshall being of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament: To wit- I desire that all my just debts be paid and the balance of my property disposed of in the following manner

I give to my daughter Catharine Gusham 1 pr of Chute Draw - 1 Large Looking Glass - The small bed and furnished. 1 pr And Iron 1 wash Bowl & Pitcher.

I give and bequeath to my son Rufus H Marshall one Secretary, one ox cart, one Trap Kettle, one Bed, Bedstead & furniture, one yoke of oxen, one cow called Fanny, all my hogs, & all my household and kitchen furniture with the exception of the articles named above given to Cath.

Gusham. I also give my daughter Louisa Davis Twenty five cents, Richard L. Marshall twenty five cents, John Marshall twenty five cents and son Edward C. Marshall twenty five cents I wish my son Rufus H Marshall to administer on my estate, if it be necessary. I declare this to be my last will and testament -
