this to be my last will and testament here-
by revoking all former wills.

1st I direct that at my death all of my
just debts shall be paid.

2nd I devise and direct that my executor
herein after named, shall, after paying
all of my just debts, pay out of my
estate in the state of my uncle Walker
Brewitt, formerly of Kentucky, our Andrew
Dallas each, to my grateful daughters
Sallie C. Lipscomb and Lucy Robert Kemp.

3rd The residue of my estate, both per-
sonal and real, I give to be equally
divided between my Children Cary Strang-
han Kemp, Fanny Ann Kemp and John
William Kemp.

4th I nominate and appoint my friend
Dr. Samuel S. Newby, my executor. In
testimony whereof I have hereunto affixed
my hand and seal this 26th day of
October 1875.

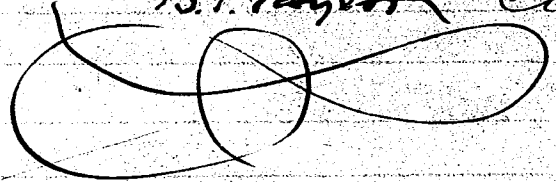
