I expect to get out of all of these slaves

in a debt not in part of my simple bill if the  
amount should not be received I wish

deducted from that portion for the use of my son  
said daughter Miranda & Bagby. Should my daughter

Miranda & Bagby leave without leaving a child I wish a  
portion of my estate left for her benefit to go to my two

Lastly I appoint my wife Mary Minor executrix  
of my last will and testament and request that she

shall well manage her to give security. I do hereby  
witness I have no more to say and that this is my last will
