

In the name of Almighty God Am
 I, Doritha Basket, of the County
 of King & Queen Va. do hereby make
 this my last will & Testament.

First I direct, and devise that all of
 my household and kitchen fur-
 niture shall be sold and the pro-
 ceeds be equally divided among
 all of my children.

Second I direct & devise that any property
 which may be inherited hereafter
 shall be equally divided among
 my surviving children.

Item As to all the estate, of whatever
 description, which I have herein
 devised or bequeathed to my
 daughters, I devise and direct
 that they shall not be entitled
 to any more than the use, and
 the interests, and profits of the
 same during their respective lives
 and at the death of any said
 daughter respectively if they shall
 leave issue, their respective portions
 of my estate herein devised to
 them, shall go, and be equally
 divided among their respective
 issues, and in the want of several
 issues being left by one daughter
 if one or more such issues die
 before marriage and before
 attaining twenty one years of
 age, the share or shares of such
 issue, so dying, shall go to the
 survivor or survivors of such issue
 in such manner, that if there

should be but one of such issue left that issue shall take the whole portion of the decd: parent. And if all the issue left by either of my daughters should die under twenty one years of age and before marriage, or in case any of my daughters die without leaving issue in such case, the whole share or shares, of such daughter or daughters, shall return to my estate and be divided among my descendants in such manner that each one of my own children who may be still living shall take one full share and the issue of any decd: child or children respectively shall together take one full share

I appoint my friend J. H. C. Jones Executor of this my last will & testament, and guardian of my children who are minors.
