done with as little delay as may be pru-
dent and practicable, Item 2. I desire
if it be necessary for the payment of my
just ^{and legal} debts, that my Executors shall sell
my real and personal estate, or so much
thereof as may be required for that purpose
either privately or at public auction, as in
their discretion may seem best.

Item 3. After payment all legal demands
against my estate, I give to my beloved
and faithful wife, the residue of my estate
both real and personal during her lifetime
to be used by her for her own maintenance
and comfort as she may see fit, and what-
ever of said ^{estate} may be remaining at her death,
I wish equally divided between all my

Children now living, and if any should die sooner than my wife, I give to the heirs of such child the portion they would be entitled to if living.

Lastly, I appoint each and each of my sons executor of this my last will and testament, but if they shall consider it unnecessary that each shall qualify, they can arrange among themselves as to which of them shall qualify. Given under my hand and seal this 23^d day of May 1882

I make this my last will and testament, I

 Jamaica, should she die without an
 lawful issue the land shall belong to
 my children or their surviving heirs
 I also give Medola my Mary Jinnys
 land and Corn and fodder enough to
 sow her one year, I also wish that
 my son in law George G. Glenn to be a
