L. Carnal, and Jas. Richard Carnal.

And lastly I do nominate and appoint my  
said sons John L. & Jas. Richard to be  
Executors of this my last will and testament.

of the state of Virginia, do make and ordain this to  
be my last will and testament, as follows: viz:

I wish all my just debts to be paid out of my  
property and after this is done; I bequeath one hundred

known at present, as the seventh Street Christian Church  
in Richmond Virginia: I do not wish this money  
to carry interest, but to be paid in annual instalments
