All the rest and residue of my estate, real, personal, or mixed, of which I shall die seized and possessed, or to which I shall be entitled at my decease, after the payment of my just debts, I give devise, and bequeath to be equally to and among my said two sons John L. Carnal, and Jas. Richard Carnal.

And lastly I do nominate and appoint my said sons John L. & Jas. Richard to be Executors of this my last will and testament. As witness the following signature and seal 1<sup>st</sup> day of October 1875

I bequeath to my niece Kate Herbert Pollard Third daughter of my said brother Joseph, one half dozen of my silver tablespoons.
