In the name of God amen.  
I Elijah Schools of the County of King & Queen  
of Virginia being weak in body but of sound  
mind, do make this my last will and testament  
In the first place, I wish all of my just and honest  
debts paid out of my estate by my executor here  
after named.

Secondly - I give to my wife Lucy Ann Schools  
Twenty acres of land including my present dwelling  
house and all the out houses, The line to come  
on the line between the lands of Mr. James Jones  
and my own farm both above and below

my present dwelling house; and to run to the swamp  
 in front of my house, so as to include the dwelling house  
 and all the out houses, and the lands around them,  
 to have and hold the same during his natural life.  
 And then to his children Alice Fogg and Thomas  
 Martin forever. And from the sale of my personal  
 property, I give to my wife Lucy Ann Schools the sum  
 of Thirty (\$30<sup>00</sup>) dollars. I also give to my wife enough  
 timber elsewhere on my farm for fire wood and aile  
 timber during her life. Also all of the furniture  
 bedding &c of which she was possessed at the time  
 of my marriage to her shall be hers together with  
 whatever bed quilts &c she may have made since  
 that time. And as to the rest of my estate I give  
 to my children Mary Ellen Mitchell, Elijah G  
 Schools, Addison F. Schools, Kitty A. Schools, Agnes  
 E Schools, and to my grand daughter Mary A  
 Ball, to be equally divided between them. As to the portion  
 of Mary E Mitchell I give it to her during her natural life  
 and then to her living children. And as to the portion  
 of Mary A. Ball I leave in trust to Lett Martin to hold  
 for her until she shall become twenty one years of  
 age, and then the said Lett Martin shall turn it  
 over to her the said Mary A. Ball. But should any  
 of my above named children die without a living  
 child, then their part of my estate shall be equally  
 divided among the rest of my living children.  
 And to the heirs of Maria L Alexander I give  
 the sum of Twenty (20<sup>00</sup>) five cents. And to Bettie E Alex  
 ander I give Twenty five (25<sup>00</sup>) cents. Lastly I hereby
