In the name of God, amen: I, Eliza P. Walton
 of the County of King & Queen do make this
 my last will and testament, hereby revoking
 King all former wills heretofore by me made
 First after the payment of my ~~last~~ debts I
 devise and bequeath to my sister Lucy M.
 Pyne all my estate both real and personal
 to be used and enjoyed by her for the term
 of her life for her maintenance and support
 with power for her my said Sister to sell in
 part thereof as may be necessary for the pur-
 pose of her comfort & support as aforesaid.
 Second, At the death of my said Sister
 Lucy I will give such portion of my said
 estate as may then remain to be equally
 divided between my sister Catharine
 Hilliard and my friend George W. Coste
 who married my niece Louisa. These I
 to have and their heirs forever.
