gentleman. I also leave to my daughter Mary Ann  
one table, one trunk, one blanket, one pair of shoes, one  
spread, one Carpet Bag and all of my wearing clothes  
and at the death of my daughter Mary Ann I wish  
the same portion of the above to go to Robert W. Milby  
youngest daughter of Mary Ann Milby and her  
husband. I also give to my son a daughter  
Clarissa one dress, one shawl, one shawl and one  
coat but the three last named articles are now

on the possession of Mrs. Allen Broach.

I also give in fee simple to my daughter Mary Ann Milby all of the money which may be found in my possession at the time of my death.

Lastly I appoint my daughter Mary Ann Milby executrix and desire that the Court may suffer her to qualify as such without giving any security. These bequeathments are my last will and testament given under my hand & seal this the eighth day of June eighteen hundred and fifty eight
