last will and testament

First I desire to be buried in a Christian like manner
Secondly I desire all of my just debts paid

Thirdly I wish to dispose of the remainder of my estate
in the following manner

I give to my daughter Mary Ann Blaney all of the
money due me from the estate of Robert and Mitty in
proportion. Also to my beloved daughter Mary Ann
one half, one third, one fifth, half placed with her
brother, one brother and all of my money left over
and at the death of my daughter Mary Ann I wish
the loan portion of the above to go to Charles Coffey
youngest daughter of Mary Ann and Mitty before any
other bequeathed, in view of her being my grand daughter
Charles and Daniel are debtors to me owing
me at the time last named and the same

on the possession of Mrs. Allen Broach.

I also give in fee simple to my daughter Mary Ann Milby all of the money which may be found in my possession at the time of my death.

Lastly I appoint my daughter Mary Ann Milby executrix and desire that the Court may suffer her to qualify as such without giving any security. These be my last will and testament given under my hand at Seal this 22nd day of December eighteen hundred and fifty eight.
