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In the name of God Amen I Fountain W Cook
of King and Queen County, do make this my last will and testament
as follows, to wit:

Item I give and bequeath to my wife Ann I Cook
absolutely and as her own property one third in value of my
whole estate, after the payment of debts and expenses of
administration which third she may select for herself and
inland or other property, and I lend to my said wife, during
her lifetime, the remaining two thirds of my estate.

Item Should my said wife marry again I direct and
devise, that no portion of my estate whether given to her absolute
or lent to her during her lifetime shall be subject in any way
to the debts contracts or control of any future husband or
husbands which she may have, but upon her marriage she shall
hold the said estate subject however to the provisions of the
foregoing clause for her sole and separate use, as if she were
still a feme sole.

Item At the death of my wife, should she leave issue
surviving her whether issue of our marriage or of any subsequent
marriage or marriages which she may contract I direct
that the two thirds of my estate, which I have herein lent
her during her lifetime, shall descend and pass to said issue
according to the laws now in force in Virginia regulating
the distribution of intestate estates.

Item Should my wife leave no issue surviving her, then
at her death I give and bequeath the two thirds of my
estate, which I have herein lent to her during her lifetime
to my own offspring to be distributed among them according
to the laws now in force in Virginia regulating descent and the
distribution of intestate estates. In witness whereof I have hereunto
subscribed my name and affixed my seal this 29th day of May 18
