

At a Court held for King and Queen County at the Court House
on Thursday the 11th of February 1867 This writing
purporting to be the last will and Testament of Temple
Walker deceased was produced in Court and there being
no subscribing Witnesses thereto Robert Pollard and William
M. Walker were sworn and severally depone that they were
well acquainted with the Testators hand writing and verily
believe the said writing and name therein subscribed
to be wholly written by the Testators own hand
Whereupon it is ordered that the said writing be
recorded as the true last will and Testament of
the said Temple Walker deceased.

In the name of God Amen I Frances A. Blane
of the County of King and Queen and State of Virginia do
make this my last will and Testament as follows to wit
I desire and direct Frederick Blane Son to pay all
of my just debts out of funds in his hands due to me by
the death of my child and after the payment of said
just debts the remainder of any of said money due
my Estate in his hands to be delivered over to my
green color herein after to be named as part of my estate
to be disposed of as herein after to be directed

I give and bequeath to my friend August
Proctor the copy of John Thomas Proctor in
simple one large rather but but contrast our pair of
shirts one white counterpane one blue blanket one
our pair of pillows and slippers

The remainder of my Estate both real &
personal with all appurtenances thereto I give
and bequeath unto simple to Miles Le Cor the
son of my friend James Cor of King and Queen
County Virginia, to him and his heirs forever

and I do hereby constitute and appoint these
 Miles W Corry executor of this my last will
 Testament. Given under my hand this 10
 day of November eighteenth hundred and fifty
 signed in the presence of ^{per} Frances A. ^{Shook} Blank
 and other request in
 the presence of each other
