I. Henry Hutchinson of the County of King & Queen
 and State of Virginia, being of sound mind and disposing
 memory, but weak and feeble in body, do make this
 my last will and testament in manner and form
 as follows; to wit, After the payment of my funeral
 expenses and all my just debts, I lend all my
 estate, real and personal, to my wife, so long as

may remain my widow. In case my widow should marry I wish her to be thirded.

At the death of my widow I wish my property to be equally divided between my three children Richard Paine, Mary Susan, and William Henry.

In case she should marry I wish my Executors to see that my children be properly educated. I request my friend David P. Wright to act as my executor, and in case of his refusal I wish any discreet and prudent man to act.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 26th day of July 1875.
