Item I wish my negroes to be equally divided between my two sons Ira B. Leathorn and Andrew B. Leathorn not well away. Item I wish to be buried in the grave yard where my wife was buried. I wish Ira B. Leathorn to have a post railing and railing put around my family graves.

Item I constitute and appoint my son Ira B. Leathorn Executor of this my last will and Testament. For doing whereof I have him unto set my hand and affixed my seal this 22nd day of February 1864.

Item I wish my Executor not to give security on his qualification on my estate.

At a Court held for King and Queen County at Stevensville on Thursday the 1st day of December 1864. This last will and Testament of Herbage H. Leathorn (decd) was offered for proof and there being no subscribing witness thereto William S. Graham and George B. Mann were sworn and severally depose that they were well acquainted with the hand writing of the testator and verily believed the said writing and name thereto subscribed to be wholly written by the testator alive and whereupon the said writing is ordered to be recorded as the true last will and Testament of the said Herbage H. Leathorn (decd).
