First. I direct my executor to sell all my property, real and personal, and collect what money is due me as far as possible, and to pay all my debts.

Secondly. After paying all my <sup>just</sup> debts. I direct that one third of what remains to be given to my sister, Maria F. Tate, and the remaining two thirds I give to my sister, Phoebe Broach.

Lastly. I appoint as my executor Ethier S. Wilson, who may qualify without security.

Wilson, the subscribers, witnesses or jurors, and ordered to be recorded, and in the execution of Ethier S. Wilson the executor therein named he has here to qualify. Whereupon he executed and in the presence of six hundred dollars & more, and filed a return thereon without duty, the said return having requested in his will

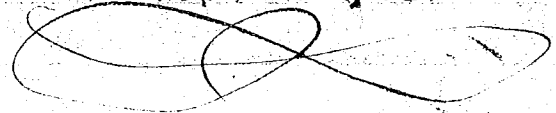
that no surety be required of his said executor.

description not disposed of in this will  
and to be equally divided between my
