and ordain this my last will and testa-  
ment, hereby revoking all former wills  
heretofore made by me, D. I. J.

First, my will and desire is that all  
my just debts be first paid out of my  
estate by my representative herein  
after named.

2<sup>d</sup>. I bind all of my estate real and personal to my beloved wife Mary  
J. Hart, so long as she remains my widow  
should she marry, or die without mar-  
rying again, then I give to my brother  
Joseph H. Hart all of my estate real and personal, should my brother Joseph  
H. Hart die before my wife <sup>and</sup> give my  
estate above mentioned to his sur-  
viving children.

3<sup>rd</sup>. I appoint my wife Mary J. Hart  
my Executor without being required by  
the Court to give security, to carry into  
effect the provisions of this my last  
will and testament.

Eight hundred & Seventy one.
