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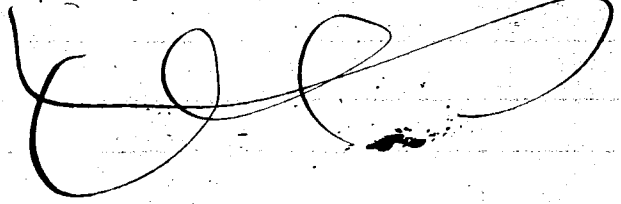
Teste I B. G. Massey, Do make this my last will

Thirdly I have devised and given to Wil-

the tract of land lying west of the Rappahannock
road which contains two hundred
acres, should Elizabeth G. Massey my
wife survive and she has the privilege
of holding her dower in all of my land per-
taining for her support. I have a piece of land
lying east of the Rappahannock road
containing thirty six acres which I have
devised this I also give to William G. Ma-
sey and William T. McInnis to chop and
be they may be chopped. I also give to
the above named persons what stood
there way to my property after my just
debt and said to be equally divided
I give to Mary A. T. McInnis one bed,
iron and kitchen and the remaining
portion of my House and lot and skeleton
motion is to remain the property of my
wife Elizabeth G. Massey her life and

At the death of the late of her husband is paid the
 remainder to be equally divided between the
 heirs of Massy and William T. Steiner,
 To this instrument of writing I assign my
 name and seal as testator and also the
 respective number of witnesses.

April 22nd I hereby desire my wife R. T. Steiner &
 my brother in law A. B. Evans and my Cousin
 J. G. Steiner to act as trustees, to hold and manage
 my entire estate for the support and benefit
 of my wife and children, especially for the
 education of the latter and the payment of
 my debts, I further desire that they should not
 be required to give ^{any} additional security, I

I wish my boys to have each a professional
 education that they and my daughters all
 should have as good an education as my
 estate can possibly afford. I desire that
 that my family should be swayed & kept
 together for the other objects would all the
 children be educated and so leave for
 my wife and children and that part
 of it certainly help with the building
 and the glass window should not be
 sold and sold except with the desired
 connection and concurrence of all the
 trustees and my wife. Should any of my
 children want to be educated, I
 desire to have such assistance,
 rendered them with the joint approbation
 and concurrence of the trustees and my
 wife as to them my son just residing
 after the accomplishment of the other un-
 dermentioned objects, say some can take ^{or have} my family
 should they wish it and do so either sepa-
 rately or jointly by paying to the other children
 the assessed value of the land, subject to my
 wife's life interest as I desire to secure
 her during her life, certainly her widowhood
 a comfortable board and support. I desire
 to leave my land to my daughters and should
 my sons be either unwilling or unable to
 avoid themselves of it, I give my voice
 and which ever my father & my son
 spent out of Chamber furniture, Carriage and
 a pair of horses to my wife, all the rest
 of my furniture or such of it as they may
 wish, to my children. Should some of my
 children buy my land or do so to do
 it fairly & equitably to all then it is to

sold, and the proceeds divided equally among
them, after all shall have been educated and
subject to my wife's life interest. These moneys to be
sold under and is decreed but by my Trustees
and wife, I refer to the usual sold after one
death, I severally and Confidantly Commit
my wife ^{and children} to the care and Blessings of
Almighty God and hope ^{that} they all may live
up to him as their Heavenly Father. That the
intent and Consideration for each other
under all circumstances may prevail among
them (except my wife and children).
