County N.H. do make this my last will and tes-
tament as follows, I wish all my just debts to
be paid. If Chas. Ryland will take it I wish
him to have the one hundred and thirty two
acres of land below Bro. Rindus's river, New
Shaw's river, in payment for Bro's board for
the 3 sessions past & for Rindus's board to
complete his course of study at Richmond
College; or the land to be sold & the proceeds
\$100. per session. The 93 acres near Smith's
old bridges and my $\frac{1}{2}$ interest in old
mill seat & land containing 100 or more
acres, to be sold if thought advisable,
to meet necessary supplies & provide for
the completion of Rindus's education, when
if he continues to apply himself well,
or as to afford encouragement will prob-
ably require 3 sessions after the present, when
as Bro. Rindus, I suppose would have to
make arrangements for the land & then for
Bro Rindus, but I have not had the full view
