

Headquarters P. O. 21st of a Regiment

Dear Flagah Church & Angle 6th 0. A.

March 31st 1864

Knowing that in such times as we now live and circumstances as I am now, as a Sergeant in the Army of the Confederate States, the time may come when it will be impossible to give such strictures in regard to my temporal affairs as I wish, thereof I make this my last Will and Testament and hereby constitute and appoint my father-in-law James McAffee my trustee and lawfully exec to carry out all the provisions of it without security.

It is my wish that my wife Charlotte E. Tabb shall have what little property I possess consisting now of a house lot on West side of second street between major Cary streets in the City of Richmond, some furniture at P.M. Tabb Jr. in said City a lot of which will be found in my writing desk, which desk with a medicine chest is now being kept by my mother Mrs Martha S. Tabb, two bonds of the Confederate States amounting to five hundred dollars each, one of the latter dated sometime in September 1863 & the money or checks for the other having been sent to the order of P.M. Tabb Jr. within the last three days. A pew in the First Presbyterian (F. M.) Church No. 30 a dozen silver spoons, sugar tongs and salt spoons. The Silver being now at P.M. Tabb Jr. in a small wooden box with the lid
top painted red; and last fall that I now recollect a hat in Hollywood Cemetery where I sincerely desire that, of possible the mortal remains of myself my body to be laid low lying with (and) eight children may be placed near the grave of our little child (and) that are enclosures before a record be set.

I name my wife Mary against me to my executor James McAffee to have all the aforesaid property as guardian of my children (and) in either event I wish him to have full power to sell the House and lot or any other real or personal property (and) invest the proceeds so he may think best with the best interest effected that this will be my last & properd wishes will be carried out I remain to all my friends this March 31st 1864

deceased. On condition now of the said James McAffies who
made such witness and witness security from being required
by the (said) Will (written and acknowledged above in
the penalty of forty four thousand dollars conditioned according
thereto, Certificate is granted the said James McAffies for
obtaining a probate of the (said) Will in due form.

(3d) The balance of my estate I wish to be equally divided
between my living children or their legal heirs. But my two
older sons are to have a horse, saddle and bridle each. Extra

(4th) I appoint my two sons A. T. & J. H. Pleakins &
