3rd In consideration of the facts that
my son, Andrew L. Haynes, has not re-
ceived the same educational ad-
vantages with my other children
(and also has borne the burden of sup-
port, and old age for myself and
his mother, therefore I will that at
the death of my wife, my son, An-
drew L. Haynes shall receive two
thirds of my landed estate

4th I will that the remaining one
third of the landed estate shall
be equally divided between
sons William C. Haynes, John K. Hay-
nes Jr. George A. Haynes, and my daugh-
ter Elizabeth Hoadley.

5th. I appoint as the Executors of this my last will and testament, my sons Andrew L. Haynes, and George A. Haynes, without security.

In the name of God, Amen: I, John M. H. Kins of King & Queen County, Virginia, hereby revoke all other and former wills made by me, and do make this my last will and Testament, as follows, to wit:

Item. I give & bequeath to my Step daughter, Catharine Bagby, in consideration of her kindness and attention to me, a feather bed and Stead, and furniture therefor, which she may select for herself, from among articles of the kind which I may leave, and the sum of one thousand dollars, with the payment of which, I charge my whole estate.

Item I direct that my Executors shall sell the small tract of land, lying on the public road, leading from "Shepherd's" meeting house to St. Stephen's; adjoining the lands of the estate of Mesley Rowe dead: and the lands of my son William G. Watkins, which contains two five acres; and if my personal property, & the proceeds of sale of said tract should not be sufficient to pay my debts, & the legacy herein before given to my Step daughter, I direct that my Executors shall then sell that portion of the tract of land called "Bohannan's" which lies adjacent to the lands lately purchased of James R. Steel from the heirs of John Russell so to be cut off by a straight line, so as to include the point of pines on the main road, provided the price of Eight dollars per acre can be obtained for the same; and if a sufficient fund should not thus be obtained for the purposes, then I direct that my Executors shall sell out my tract called "Bohannan's," Smithfield, and the tract on which I reside, from year to year, until a sum
