 or a day.

4. I give to my daughter Mary Jane
 not fifty dollars, and Siry Ann Schenck,
 give one hundred dollars, to be paid
 them by my Executor. All my property
 except the land I wish sold, and after
 the hundred and fifty dollars to the girls,
 balance if any, equally divided between
 my two sons Madison Minor and
 Minor to them and their heirs forever.
 Last of all I leave my son Madison
 Executor to this my last will and

I desire that the twenty shares of State Stock, which I own, shall be divided as follows. viz: Eight shares are to be given to my nephew George Robt Richards, Eight shares to Mrs. Mary Catherine Brundy & her children, to be equally divided there, with this exception. viz: I desire that three shares of the portion going to Mrs. Mary Cath. Brundy & her children, shall be given to Miss Lucy Brundy as her portion with the understanding that she shall exclude her from any further share. The remaining four shares are to be disposed of as follows. viz: Ten dollars a piece to Dr. Robt Lyne his daughter, Rebecca Lyne, and, Nellie Lyne. Ten dollars to each of Richard B. Lyne daughter, Rebecca Lyne, Rebecca Lyne, & Rebecca Lyne, ten dollars to each of Rebecca Lyne, ten dollars each to Rebecca L. Archer & Rebecca L. Archer, ten dollars to Mrs. Elizabeth Hunter, and ten dollars to Miss Frances Lyne. The remaining portion of the last four shares mentioned, I desire to go to the payment of any debts now due or hereafter contracted. I desire that the whole sum of shares of
