Wt. In the name of God Amen, I, John Knappman of King and Queen do make this my last will & testament, as follows, 1st First, I desire that my body may be decently buried, without needless expense, in a manner corresponding to my estate & situation in life, 2nd Secondly, I think that all my just debts be paid as soon after my decease as conveniently may be, and to that end I charge my whole estate, real & personal, with same, 3rd Thirdly, I give to my dear wife Lucy Knappman in testimony of my

affection for her, all of my property, real
 personal, to have & use the same for her
 life & charge the same with the payment
 of all her just debts, at her death, and
 necessary expenses funeral or others, and
 after her death what remains, after paying
 the debts and expenses above mentioned
 to go as hereinafter provided, Giving my
 wife the right to cut or sell any timber
 on any of my land that she may wish
 or desire 4th Fourthly, I give devise & bequeath
 to my Grandson John Thomas Davenport,
 fifty six acres of land which I bought
 from Mr Richard Gametts estate, and ad-
 joining Mr William Buys estate, to him
 & his heirs, but should he die without
 heirs of his body then the same to fall
 back to my other Grandchildren, That his
 father may become his guardian and hold
 same for him, and it is my desire and
 request, that the said land shall be held
 for my said Grandson John Thomas Davenport
 until he reaches the age of twenty five
 years, & that no timber shall be cut or
 sold by him until he reaches that age,
 5th Fifthly, I give at the death of my wife
 to my three Children all the balance of
 my real estate to be held & used in common
 by them, & at their death to go equally to
 my Grandchildren, and it is my desire
 that they may live & enjoy it together in
 quietness & peace, Giving to my daughter
 Maria Ann backley the use of my house
 at the death of my wife, for her life and
 it is my desire that she may have quiet
 possession of same,

6, Sixthly, after the death of my wife I desire that whatever personal property shall remain unincumbered and undisposed of by my wife and after all her debts and expenses have been paid shall be sold and money divided between my child and my grand son John Thomas Desanper taking his dead mother's share,

7 Seventhly, I desire my executor hereinafter appointed to make deed to Margaret Roberts for a tract of land of about fifteen acres sold her by me, when she shall have finished paying for same,

8 Eighthly, I do appoint T. J. Clumins to be executor of this my last will & testament, and I desire that he shall not be required to give security further furnished or within than,

9 Ninthly, I hereby revoke all other and former wills or codicils by me at any time heretofore made, Witness my hand and seal this the 22nd day of August in the year of our Lord 1884,
