

(4) I Joseph Collier of Wing and Queen County do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit that is to say first desire that all the perishable part of my estate be immediately sold after my decease. Out of the money arising there from all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid. Should my perishable be more than sufficient to pay my just debts and funeral expenses then I desire that my executor hereafter named may lend out at legal interest until my Grandson Thomas Dudley arrives at the age of twenty one years old or until his death. Should he not live until he arrives at that age but should he live to be the age of twenty one I then leave to my Grandson Thomas Dudley all the money that may remain after paying my debts and funeral expenses including the interest that will have accumulated when he arrives to that age & at the death of my Grandson Thomas Dudley I give the same to the halfsely begotten children of the said Thomas Dudley. but should my grandson die without a lawfully begotten child then give the money above named to my nephew John Collier. I by I leave to my Grandson Thomas Dudley the tract of land on which I live supposed to be from 450 to 500 acres During his life and at his death I give the said to the lawfully begotten children of the said Thomas Dudley if any be then living but if my Grandson Thomas Dudley dies without leaving a lawfully begotten child I then give the abovementioned tract of land to my nephew John Collier. Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friend Rodenick Bland executor of this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other or former Wills or testaments by me made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 18th day of August One thousand eight hundred and thirty four.
