1st. If I should die in convenient distance of James Roy Watkins, I desire that he shall bury my body decently buried.

2nd. If I should die owing any debts I desire James Roy Watkins will attend to and see they are paid.

3rd. I give and bequeath and devise to James Roy Watkins my tract of land known as (Tutans Ridge) with the rights members and appurtenances to the same James Roy Watkins, to have and to hold to him the same James Roy Watkins to his heirs and assigns forever.

4th. I also give and bequeath to James Roy Watkins all my mechanical tools and chest, and all other things I may possess at the time of my death. I also give to James Roy Watkins all debts that are owing to me. Witness my hand and seal this 2nd day of January in the year of our Lord 1893.

payment of my debts, I direct to my wife Julia
during her life, to furnish a home and make
provision for her during her life and for my
