

I Levi Carlton of King & Green County, and State of Virginia do hereby make my last will and testament as follows to wit:

1<sup>st</sup> I direct that all my just debts be paid

2<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath to my wife Columbia A Carlton for and during her natural life all my estate both real and personal, with the privilege of using and disposing of any of the personal property in any way she may see fit which may be necessary for her proper maintenance and support.

3<sup>d</sup> At the death of my wife, I give and bequeath all my real estate, and such of my personal estate as may then remain to Moland Oliver and Ham F Oliver, children of Logan Oliver, to be shared equally between them.

4<sup>th</sup> I request that my wife advise with my Cousin Logan Oliver in all matters in which she may need the aid and advice of a friend.

5<sup>th</sup> I choose and appoint my wife, Columbia A Carlton Executrix of this my last will and testament and request that she be permitted to qualify as such without security. Witness my hand and seal this 17<sup>th</sup> day of April 1884
