The Condition of this obligation is that if the said Elias Watlington administrator with the will annexed of the goods chattels and credits of Lydia Dillard deceased do make a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods chattels and credits of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of him the said Elias Watlington or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for him and the same be made & exhibit to the Circuit Superior Court of Law and Chancery of King and Queen, at such time as he shall be there required by the said Court; and the same goods, chattels, and credits, as well and truly administer according to law; and make a just and true account of his doings and things therein when thereunto required by the said Court; and further do well and truly pay and deliver all the legacies therein named and specified in the said will, as far as the said goods, chattels and credits will extend according to the value thereof, and of the law shall charge, then this obligation to be void or else to remain in full force
