Secondly I leave my daughter Betsey Martin for and
during her life my negro man George and after her death I give
said negro man to her son Solomon A Martin in fee simple

Thirdly I give to my two grand daughters children of my
daughter Ellen Hubbard that is to say Emma Frances, and
Mary Ellen Hubbard the following slaves to wit Henry Harry
Charlotte Juny, Mary Eliza, Nancy Lewis and Richard to
them in fee simple

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Fourthly I give to my dear grand child and Welley Ann Langham
Harvey Langham child of my son Robert Langham and a
following Slave to wit Mary Ann her two children Ann and
William and William to them in fee simple

Fifthly I give all the Real Estate that I may dispose
of to be sold by my Executors hereafter named or by my personal
representative whenever he may be upon such terms as he may
think best and the proceeds divided equally between my
grand child Emma Frances Hubbard Mary & Harveys Lang
Welley Ann Langham, John Langham and Harvey Lang
which I give to them in fee simple.

Sixthly All my personal Estate of every description
that may remain after the payment of my debts I give to my
two grand daughters Emma Frances & Mary Ellen Hubbard
equally between them and in fee simple

Lastly I constitute and appoint my friend John Pollard
Esq. of this my last Will and Testament and desire that
he may be permitted to qualify without giving security
Witness my hand and seal this 12th day of November 1862.
