Thirdly I wish all the Real Estate that may die property
of to be sold by my Executor here after named or by my person
representative whenever he may be upon such terms as the exec
think best and the proceeds divided equally between my
grand children Anna Francis Starkey & Mary E Hudson
Valley Ann Langham, John Langham and Starkey Langham
whom I give to them in fee simple.

Fourthly All my personal Estate of every description
that may remain after the payment of my debts I give to my
two grand daughters Anna Francis & Mary Ellen Hudson
equally between them and in fee simple.

Lastly I constitute and appoint my friend John P. Col-
lins of this my last will and testament ~~and~~ do make him
to be my executor to qualify you all from giving any objection
to it in my name and seal this 10th day of December 1862.
