The remaining four shares are to be disposed of as follows. viz: ten dollars apiece to Mr. Robt Synne two daughters, Betsey to Synne, and, Kettie to Synne. ten dollars to each of Richard B. Synne daughter, Ellen Synne, Betsey Synne, John Synne, & Rebecca Synne, ten dollars to Betsey Rowden, ten dollars each to Maria L. Archer & Maria E. Archer, ten dollars to Mrs. Elizabeth Hunter, and ten dollars to Miss Frances Synne. The remaining portion of the last four shares mentioned, I desire to go to the payment of any debts now due, or hereafter contracted. I desire that the whole twenty shares of
