In the name of God Amen. I Nancy Atkins
of the County of King & Queen and State of Virginia
being of sound mind and memory, and consid-
ering the uncertainty of this frail and transi-
ent life do therefore make, ordain, publish and
declare this to be my last will and testament
that is to say. first after all my lawful
debts are paid and discharge the residue
of my estate real and personal I give, bequeath
and dispose as follows, to wit

1st I give and bequeath to my son John Atkins
the sum of One dollar to him and his heirs
forever.

2^d I give and bequeath to my son Joseph Atkins
the sum of One dollar, to him and his heirs
forever.

3^d I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann Eliza
Enos, the sum of One dollar to her and her
heirs forever.

4th I give and bequeath to my granddaughter
Otelia Atkins one bedstead, feather bed,
straw bed, and said bed to be well furnished
with good bed covering, one bureau and
New Black Trunk, and all the bed clothes
and other clothing &c that may be in the
bureau and trunk at my death, to her
and her heirs forever.

5th In consideration of the kindness and
good attention that my son Alexander
Atkins has rendered to me, and his attendance
to my farm &c every since I have been left
alone and also in further consideration
of my son Alexander having sustained
heavy loss by the late war I give and bequeath
to my son Alexander Atkins all my Real
Estate, and all the rest of my personal

estate of what nature or kind soever it may be not hereinbefore particularly disposed off also all the interest that I may have or be entitled to in the real and personal Estate of my late deceased son Alonzo Atkins' estate which has not been divided and Lastly I do hereby make and appoint my son Alexander Atkins Executor of this my Last will and testament hereby revoking all other or former wills or testaments by me heretofore made, and as I have full confidence in my son Alexander I hope that Court that this will may be offered for probat will not require Security of him, and permit him to qualify without giving Security.

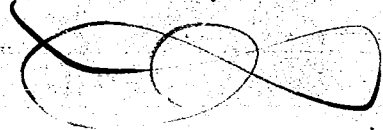

In the name of God, Amen!

I, Alexander Fleet Sr. of King
Queen County, Virginia, hereby revoking all former wills
made by me, do make this my last will and testament
as follows, to wit:-

First of all, I direct that all of my just debts be paid
and subject thereto I give and devise all of the estate
both real and personal, which I may leave at my death
to my beloved wife Martha, during her lifetime, with
power and authority if the income or profits thereof
be insufficient for her support, to use such portion of
principal, as may be necessary for the purpose- and
her death I give and devise to my daughter Sally B. Fleet
one hundred acres of my tract of land called Melvins
to be laid off, for her, adjoining the land which I
have lately conveyed to my son Christopher B. Fleet,
so as to include the buildings, yard, garden and
and wood land enough for its support, and a sufficient
front, on the main road; and the balance of my
tract of land I give and devise to my daughter, B. P.
Bagby, and my son Alexander Fleet Jr. to be divided
equally between them; and I direct that whichever
of them in such division shall receive that portion
the said land lying next to Fleetwood (which will
without buildings of any kind) shall have the right
of removing from my yard thereon, the house- known
as the old Kitchen or Fanny's house (being a double
