5<sup>th</sup>. It is my will & desire that my wife have a  
third of my estate during her natural life

Lastly, I hereby appoint my friend George K. Cas-  
ton my Executor of this my last will and tes-

In the name of God Amen: I Margaret B. Crump be-  
ing of sound mind and disposing memory do make and  
publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and  
form following: Item 1<sup>st</sup> I desire and direct that  
the payment of a bond which should be executed to me by my  
son, John B. Crump for the sum of Three Thousand dollars,  
shall not be required of him, but after my death, he shall  
be entitled to possession of said bond, and in no way be  
held accountable for the same.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give to my grand daughter, Sallie B. Crump,

(one worked and the other Calico) and all the trimmings  
to same.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give to my grand son Oliver  
Crump, son of my son John B. Crump, my bed and  
bedstead, and all the equipments belonging to the same,  
and all other bed clothing in my possession at my  
death, except that herein bequeathed to my grand  
daughter, Sallie B. Crump. I also give to him my  
wardrobe, and its contents (except my wearing  
apparel) my wash stand, basin & pitcher, a  
small feather trunk, and my easy chair.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I give to my grand daughter Mildred  
Belle Crump my Remembrance & Mirror.

Lastly I appoint my son John B. Crump executor
