and was proved by the oaths of Mr. J. Eubank
and Levi Carlton, two of the subscribing witnesses,
thereunto, and ordered to be recorded. And on the
motion of the said Reuben Walton she hath been
to qualify as Administratrix with the will an-
nexed of the said Reuben Walton died: And
thereupon she entered into and acknowledged
a Bond (with Mr. C. Nunn her Security who jus-
tified on oath as to his sufficiency) in the penalty
of Two hundred dollars (\$200) conditioned ac-
cording to law, and ordered to be recorded
