For § 1. I Robert B. Burton of King & Queen County in the State of
 Virginia, being of sound mind and disposing memory, do
 make, publish and declare this my last will and
 testament, revoking all other wills or codicils heretofore
 at any time made by me.
 First I direct that all of my just debts and funeral expenses
 be paid

Second - I hereby appoint my two sons James R. Burton and
 John Y. Burton, either of whom or both of whom may act
 my Executors of this my last will and testament and direct
 that the Court allow them or either of them, to qualify
 without giving security. But it is my desire that my
 sons and my wife shall settle my estate among
 themselves without any qualification upon the estate.

Third - I appoint my son John Y. Burton Guardian of my
 son Philip H. Burton, if he be under the age of twenty-one
 years at my death, and direct that the Court allow
 him to qualify as such Guardian without giving
 security.

Fourth - I direct that my present wife H. A. F. Burton
 shall receive during her life annually from my estate
 the sum of Fifty dollars (\$50) in lieu of her dower.
 This said sum shall be paid annually by my three
 children or their Guardians, and if any one of them
 shall make default in the payment of his proportionate
 share of this annuity - I direct that the property
 herein devised and bequeathed to the one so failing

or making defunct shall be held responsible for the amount of his proportionate share of the annuity. And I further charge the whole of my estate with the payment of this annuity to my wife for her life.

Fifth - I give and bequeath to my son James R. Burton my dark bay mare called Nina, my saddle and bridle and a pair of steel yearlings, one pieb, one red, or in lieu thereof the sum of One hundred dollars, and in addition to these specific chattels or their alternative. I give and bequeath to my said son James R. Burton the sum of Five hundred dollars (\$500.-) to be paid out of my estate.

Sixth - I give to my son John W. Burton one yearling to be worth about ten dollars, or in lieu thereof whichever he may prefer the sum of ten dollars.

Seventh - I give and bequeath to my son Philip H. Burton my best buggy and harness and two Cows to be selected by him, or in lieu of these specific chattels the sum of One hundred dollars.

Eighth - I direct that my children shall keep up the life insurance policy on my wife's life, which policy is for the benefit of my said children.

Ninth - All of the rest of my estate both real and personal, I give devise and bequeath to my three sons to be equally divided among them.
