The summa that I have received from her father's estate in fee simple: 2. In case my wife shall continue my widow it is will & desire that all my estate shall be kept together in worked for the support of wife and education of my son Robert B. Boyd until he arrives to the age of twenty one. He takes possession of the estate named him, but should she marry it is that she shall only receive the negroes above mentioned I give to Frances Boyd one negro girl named Alice to her & her heirs forever. The said girl die she shall continue to be furnished with a maid, house, clothes & boarded from the proceeds of my estate, in case my son before mention Robert arrives to the age of twenty one give to my brother Thomas place as he give named Lucy other & his heirs will my land, the balance of my negroes, Stock, Horses, hounds Kitchen furniture and everything else of property that Sonny die possessed of I give to my son Robert B. Boyd and his heirs lawfully begotten, but should my son die without such heir it is then my will that the land given him shall go my brother William Boyd, and at his

taining a probate thereof in accordance.
