shall belong to my Grandchildren or sur-
viving heirs. I also leave to my Grand-
daughter Medola E. Carr the land lying
North of the said road from Wans Bridge
to the line paper in the road running to
Jennings, should she die without an
lawful issue the land shall belong to
my children or their surviving heirs.
I also give Medola my Man Jimmy
Lind and Corn and fodder enough to
sow her one year, I also wish that
my son in law George G. Glenn to become

her trustee without any security, I leave
the rest of my effects to the two persons
named in the above will to be equally
divided between them,
