

I, Robert Pollard Jr. do make this my last Will and Testament.

After the payment of my debts, I give and bequeath the balance of my estate, both real and personal, as follows. One third of the said balance, I give to my dear wife Sarah, to her, and her heirs forever; the remaining two thirds I give to my niece Maria L. Floss and her children, to be equally divided among them to them, and their heirs forever.

I appoint my friend Samuel F. Harwood my executor and direct that no security be required of him as such Executor, having full confidence in his integrity. Witness my hand and seal this ninth day of January 1867.

In King & Queen County Court March 10th 1876.

This writing purporting to be the last will and testament of Robert Pollard Jr. deceased, was produced in Court by Samuel F. Harwood the Executor therein named, and there being no subscribing witness thereto James M. Diffin & Edgar D. Montague were sworn, and solemnly deposed that they are well acquainted with the testator's handwriting, and verily believe the said writing, and the name thereto subscribed, to be wholly written by the testator's own hand. Whereupon the said writing is ordered to be recorded as the will and testament of the said Robert Pollard Jr. deceased. And on the motion of the said Samuel F. Harwood the Executor therein named, who made oath thereto, entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Twenty five Hundred dollars, conditioned as the law directs, without surety, the testator having requested in his said will, that no security be required of his said Executor. Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat of the said will in due form.
