paid out of my estate, the balance of estate both real
(and personal I wish to be equally divided among my
children Emeline Johnson decr Joseph A Pynes,
Louisa V Humphrey Margaret Evans, William M
Pynes Catharine & Mary Hancy Pynes, Martha C
Pynes. My tract of land called Evans to be sold at 12
months credit (it contains 50 acres more or less) the
proceeds equally divided among the above named
children. My Service man, household and kitchen
furniture to be sold as my executors may deem (and
equally divided among my legals. I appoint
Barbara F Sylva and Mary Hancy Pynes
to this my last Will and Testament given under
my hand and seal this 20th day of November in
the year of our Lord 1867

Maria Jackson my Executor to this my last will
