my last will (and) testament. I leave all my property
to my wife Jane and as far as I give my house
(and) west of the spring swamp to my son Allen and
the same over the swamp on the west & south
side to my daughter Lucy & Gary & my neck
land to my daughter Ellen & Tanny & I
give my real horse stock & furniture on the lot
Point land company to my son Bernard and
Sister Billie Henry provided they do not
bring any claim against my estate if they do
said interest to be void and pay their claims. I
to my son William on horse call & Betty &
& I give to my sons John & Thomas 13 each
each & I leave all the rest of my property to
& pay my debts & expenses & I leave my son
to Bernard my account for them not to give
on my estate given under my hand and seal this
day of December 1868

A Court held for King and Queen County at the Courthouse
on Thursday the 11th of February 1869. This writing
purporting to be the last will and testament of Temple
Walker deceased was produced in Court and there being
no subscribing witnesses thereto Robert Solloway and William
M. Walker were sworn and severally depone that they were
well acquainted with the Testator's hand writing and verily
believed the said writing and name therein subscribed
to be wholly written by the Testator's own hand
Whereupon it is ordered that the said writing be
recorded as the true last will and testament of
the said Temple Walker deceased.

In the name of God Amen I Frances A. Blane
of the County of King and Queen and State of Virginia do
make this my last will and testament as follows to wit
I do give and direct Frederick Blane, Son to pay all
of my just debts out of funds in his hands due to me by
the death of my father and after the payment of said
just debts the remainder of any of said money due
my Estate in his hands to be allowed over to my
legitimate heirs or to be named as part of my estate
to be disposed of as herein after to be directed

I give and bequeath to my friend August
Booper the corp of John Thomas Booper wife
simple one large rather but one tract of our pair of
lands, one which contains one blue tract and
one pair of follows our slips

The remainder of my Estate both real &
personal with all appurtenances thereto I give
and bequeath unto Temple to Miles to Cor the
son of my friend James Cor of King and Queen
County Virginia, to him and his heirs forever
