I Simple Walker do desire and make this to be
my last will and testament. I leave all my prop-
erty to my wife Anna and at her death I give my house &
land west of the spring swamp to my son Almon &
& the same over the swamp on the west & south
side to my daughter Lucy's Goy & my next
land to my Daughter Anna & Harry S. an
I give my rail road stock & entom on the
Point land company to my son Remond and
Sister Billie Steary provided they do not
bring any claim against my estate if they do not
pay interest to me and pay my claims. I
leave my collection on horse called Betsy to
my son William on horse called Betsy to
my son John S. Thomas 13 years old
and I leave all the rest of my property to
pay my debts & expenses etc & leave my son
to the rest of my assets for him not to give some
to my estate Garrison my hundred and eight
day of December 1868 Simple Walker

At a Court held for King and Queen County at the Courthouse
on Thursday the 11th of February 1869. This writing
purporting to be the last will and testament of Temper
Walker deceased was produced in Court and there being
no subscribing witness there to above Testators and William
Walker was sworn and severally deposed that they were
well acquainted with the Testators handwriting and verily
believed the said writing and name there subscribed
to be wholly written by the Testators own hand
Whereupon it is ordered that the said writing be
recorded as above last Will and Testament of
the said Temper Walker deceased.

In the name of God Amen I James Abbott
of the County of King and Queen State of Virginia do
make this my last will and testament as follows to wit
I do will and direct Richard Black Senior to pay all
my just debts out of funds in his hands due to me by
the date of my death and after the payment of my
just debts the remainder of any of such money due
my estate in his hands to be divided over to my
Grandson Henry Walker to be named as part of my estate
to be disposed of as herein after to be directed.

I give and bequeath to my son August
Becker the wife of John James Becker except
simple one long feather bed and bedding consisting of
sheet, one white Counterpane, one blue blanket and
one pair of pillows case & slips.

The remainder of my Estate both real &
personal with all appurtenances thereto I give
and bequeath unto Temper Walker to him the
son of my friend James Cox of King and Queen
County Virginia, his heirs and his wife forever.
