needed for her support during her lifetime
and remaining, shall be divided equally between my
children but if either should die first leaving no
fully begotten issue, the portion of such
deceased child shall go to his or her
children 4th If here ever my wife the
Sarah Jane Cosy should die young after
death, of her direct and descent, she
shall only take one third of my
estate, both real and personal, for the

one and hundred during her lifetime, and the
two thirds of my estate at the time of her
marriage shall be equally divided among my
children, the children of my deceased child
to have their inheritance.


