

I Thomas M Henley of the County of King Queen
and State of Virginia do constitute and appoint this
my last will & testament in manner and form follow-
ing

Item 1st I give to my beloved wife Priscilla B.
Henley my estate of every kind whatever for her
sole and separate use, free from the contracts, con-
trol, or marital rights of any future husband she
may have, for and during her natural life, for
the mutual support and maintenance of herself
and my children

Item 2nd If my beloved wife should find herself
unable to manage the farm, my present homestead,
or deem it to be her interest and the interest of
my children to sell the whole or any part of said
estate she is hereby authorized to do so, and invest
the proceeds of said estate in such manner she
may deem best, to be held strictly by her with
the restrictions and under the conditions specified
in item first

Item 3 My wife if she consider it necessary
is authorized to spend a portion of the prin-
cipal for her support and the support and
education of my children

Item 4th At the death of my beloved wife
whatever remains of my estate shall be equally
divided among my children

Item 5th I leave it optional with my wife
as to selling my personally

Item 6th I appoint my beloved wife — Ex-
ecutrix of this my last will and testament, with
the request that the Court require no security
of her.
