3<sup>d</sup> I desire our said Executors to sell my farm on which I now reside to white persons if possible on a credit of six and twelve months with interest from day of sale, title retained until the purchase price is fully paid. my mill property in King & Queen and Gloucester Counties not to be sold in haste, but to be managed and sold as my Executors may think best

4<sup>th</sup> The proceeds from sale of my property both real and personal, after the current <sup>of this will and my funeral expenses</sup> expenses to be applied to the payment of my just debts, and the residue thereof I give to the Southern Methodist Missionary Society or the proper authorities for the benefit of said Society-

Lastly- After payment in full for my real estate to our said Executors, they shall convey by deed said real estate to the purchaser - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand, and affixed my seal this 5<sup>th</sup> day of May 1891

(The testator having requested that no security be required of his said executors) but this is granted them for obtaining a probat of said will in due form
