 form

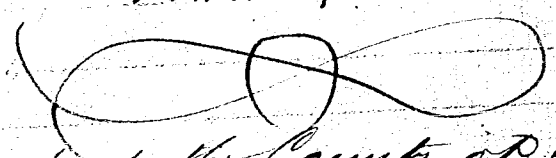

I Thomas W. Gamett of the County of King
 and Queen and State of Virginia, being sound
 mind doth make this my last will and testa-
 ment renouncing all others heretofore made
 First I wish all my just debts paid.
 Secondly. I leave all my estate to my brother
 James R. Gamett to receive all the rents
 and income arising thereon for his own use
 except two pieces of land so called a piece
 called Melrose containing ninety two & half
 acres and also a piece next to Moriah
 a. Hamdly Commencing at my road gate and
 running down the road and over the swamp
 to where there was an old gate close to the

bridge, showed along and other clerk found
 records Robert Sully's land until
 you reach a road to the right, there
 across the field a straight line to the
 Sully land to the corner of what is called
 the Hickory woods and including some
 woods on the main road supposed to stand
 seventy or eighty acres the two pieces of land
 named above I give to the children of my
 beloved brother W. W. Goulet but my
 brother James H. Goulet is to have the
 privilege of buying said land by paying
 my brother W. W. Goulet's children one
 thousand dollars in one and two years.
 I also give all the balance of my estate
 to the children of my brother J. N. Gar-
 rett who shall be living at his death.
 A Miss Harris except Rosa V. Blaw
 who has receive four hundred dollars
 which is to be deducted from her interest
 living if not from her heirs and the
 piece of land give her called Flute hill
 my brother J. R. Goulet is either will to
 make a deed or have paid for and if
 never paid for this to go to Rosa V. Blaw
 and a small piece of landy there and
 in New William sold to Jonathan Little
 paid. I give the balance due on said
 land to my brother J. R. Goulet by his
 making her a deed to the said land and
 if never paid for it is his and if my
 brother wife Mary A. Goulet should
 be living at his death she is to have
 care of as long she remains his widow
 my brother J. R. Goulet is to have the
 balance of my estate not all ready

of the paying my debts, I also wish the Court to order
him to Quoddy on my estate without security
signed this 20th day of Feb. 1879.

Hilling and Lunenburg County Court May 8th 1879
This writing purporting to be the last will and
testament of Thomas W. Garrett deceased, was
produced in Court by James R. Garrett the
Executor therein named, and there being no
subscribing witnesses thereto, Lewis C. Hart
and James Giblin were sworn and severally
deposed that they are well acquainted with
the Testator having sitting and very often the
said writing and the same therein subscri-
bed to be wholly written by the testator
own hand, Whereupon the said writing is
ordered to be received, as the true last will
and testament of the said Thomas W. Garrett
deceased, and in motion of the said James
R. Garrett the Executor therein named,
who made oath thereto, entered into and
affirmed a bond in the penalty of
Twenty five hundred dollars (\$2500.00)
Conditioned as the law directs without secu-
rity (the Testator having requested in his
said will that no security be required
of his said Executor), a Certificate is
granted him for obtaining a probate of
the said will in due form.
