I Volney Weaver of the County of King and Queen (and State of Virginia) do hereby declare this to be my last will and Testament as follows

Item 1 I desire that after my death my whole estate shall be kept together and that no division thereof shall be made during the life time of my beloved wife, or so long as she may survive nor until my youngest child shall arrive

age of twenty one year, should my wife die before she attains to that age

Item 2 I desire that my entire estate shall be under the exclusive management and control of my beloved wife during her life, or, so long as she remains my widow to be used and disposed of for the general benefit of herself (and our children in such way as she may deem best, and most to their interest; and if at any time it should in her judgment become necessary, or to the interest of the Estate to sell any portion thereof, either real or personal for the payment of debts, that may be due from my said Estate, or for any other purpose she shall have full power and authority to do so, (and further, if she shall think proper at any time during her life to give any portion of my Estate to any one or more of my children she shall have authority to do so, but the portions so given must be fairly valued at the time by three competent appraisers and the child or children to whom it is given must account for the same at the general division of my Estate to be made hereafter

Item 3 I desire that my friend Miss Polly Collins shall have a home with my family during her life.

Item 4 I desire that at the death of my beloved wife, should she remain my widow, or when my youngest child reaches the age of twenty one year, should she die sooner, the whole of my estate shall be equally divided among all my children, then living, (and if any shall have died, leaving legal issue, such issue to take such share or shares as they would have taken had been entitled to, if living

Item 5 I desire that my beloved wife should marry again, then, I desire that my estate shall at once be divided among all my children in manner as directed in the foregoing items.

Lastly I constitute and appoint my beloved wife the executrix of this my last will, and request that the Court in which she shall qualify will not require her to give security, (and in the event that she shall die my widow and before my youngest child shall attain to the age of twenty

one year, then I requested and desired that my friends Albert H. Edwards & Henry Shall assume the management and control of my Estate until such time as my younger children should attain the age of twenty one year when I desired my Estate divided as before directed Given under my hand and seal this 15th day of January 1861
