I Wolney Walker of the County of King and State of
Virginia do make and declare this to be my last will and
testament as follows

Item 1. I desire that after my death my whole estate shall
be kept together and that no division thereof shall be made
during the life of my beloved wife or so long as she
may live nor until my youngest child shall attain

age of twenty one years, should my wife die before she attains to
that age.

Item 2. I desire that my entire estate shall be under the
exclusive management and control of my beloved wife during her
life, or, so long as she remains my widow to be used and disposed
of for the general benefit of herself and our children in such
way as she may deem best, and most to their advantage; and if
at any time it should in her judgment become necessary, or to
the interest of the Estate to sell any portion thereof, either real
or personal, for the payment of debts, that may be due from my
said Estate, or for any other purpose she shall have full power and
authority to do so; and further, if she shall think proper at any
time during her life to give any portion of my Estate to any one
or more of my children she shall have authority to do so, but the
portion so given must be fairly valued at the time by three
competent appraisors and the child or children to whom it
is given must account for the same at the general division
of my Estate to be made thereafter.

Item 3. I desire that my young Miss Polly Collins shall have
a home with my family during her life.

Item 4. I desire that at the death of my beloved wife, should
she remain my widow, or when my youngest Child reaches the age
of twenty one years, should she die sooner, the whole of my estate
shall be equally divided among all my children, then living, and
if any shall have died, leaving legitimate issue, such issue to take
such share or shares as they would have taken if their mother had
lived.

Item 5. In the event that my beloved wife should marry
again, then, I desire that my estate shall at once be divided
among all my children in manner aforesaid in the
foregoing item.

Lastly I constitute and appoint my beloved wife
Secretary of this my last will, in consequence that she can
in which she shall qualify without requiring her to give
security, and in the event that she shall die my wife and
before my youngest Child reaches the age of twenty

one years, then I request and desire that my friends Albert H.
and Edward Averill shall assume the management and
control of my Estate until such time as my younger Child
aforesaid shall attain the age of twenty one years when the
