I Walter R. Carlton of the County of King & Queen
and State of Virginia being of sound and disposing
mind and memory: Knowing the uncertainty of life, and
the certainty of death, do make publish and declare
this to be my last Will and Testament, hereby rev-
oking any and all others heretofore by me made.

I wish if then be left enough personal Estate for
the purpose, that all my just debts shall be first
paid.

I leave to my beloved and loving wife Fannie A.
Carlton all my real, and such of my personal
Estate, money Chase in action &c as may be left of
the payment of my debts while she remains my
widow, and if she should not marry again,
during her life for the benefit maintenance and
support of herself and children, the issue of my
marriage. At the event of her marriage or death
then I give and bequeath unto said Children the
whole of - Estate in absolute fee, and to their descen-
dant, or descendants. I hereby name and appoint
my said wife the Executrix of this my last Will
and Testament, with the earnest request that
she may be permitted by the Court, in which she
may qualify, to do so without giving security.
Witness my hand and seal this 6th day of
September 1869.

and Frankling Bland, children of my deceased son
Spencer Bland and their heirs forever, The tract of
Land on which my said son Spencer Bland lived
his life, and also four negroes, which I caused to be
said son Spencer Bland in his lifetime, and now
in the possession of his widow Nancy Bland
following, Isaac, George, Rachel and Roger,
and the future increase of the females thereof,
The condition that my daughter-in-law Nancy
Bland widow of my said son Spencer Bland
shall during her natural life be entitled
