I, Walter R. Carlton of the County of King & Queen and State of Virginia being of sound and disposing mind and memory: knowing the uncertainty of life, and the certainty of death, do make publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament, hereby wishing any and all others heretofore by me made.

1st I wish if there be left enough personal Estate for the purpose, that all my just debts shall be first paid.

2^d I leave to my beloved and loving wife Fannie A. Carlton all my real, and such of my personal Estate, money Chas. in action &c as may be left of the payment of my debts while she remains my widow, and if she should not marry again, during her life for the benefit maintenance and support of herself and children, the issue of my marriage. In the event of her marriage or death then I give and bequeath unto said Children the whole of - Estate in absolute fee, and to their descendant, or descendants. I hereby name and appoint my said wife the Executrix of this my last Will and Testament, with the earnest request that she may be permitted by the Court, in which she may qualify, to do so without giving security.

Witness my hand and seal this 6th day of September 1869.

In King & Queen County Court July 8th 1875.
This writing purporting to be the last Will and Testament of Walter R. Carlton decd. was produced in Court, and there being no subscribing witness Charles Robert Smith and William S. Dix were sworn and severally deposed that they are well acquainted with the Testator's hand writing

and verily believe the said writings, and the name thereto subscribed to be wholly written by the Testator's own hand. Whereupon the said writings are ordered to be recorded as the true last Will and Testament of the said Walter R. Carter died.

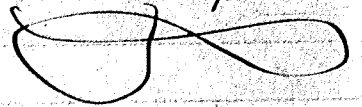

said son Spencer Bland in his lifetime, and now

following, Isaac, George, Rachel and Reage, with
all the future increase of the female thereof, on
the condition that my daughter-in-law Nancy
Bland widow of my said son Spencer Bland
shall during her natural life be entitled
