

I William to Davis to make ~~and~~ ordains this my last will and Testament

First After payment of my just debts I wish my estate to be kept together and managed for the benefit of my wife and three children until the marriage of my daughter Martha upon which went I wish my Marlborough tract of land, and so much thereof as may amount to one third of my real and personal estate to be assigned to her, at a fair valuation compared to the rest of my real estate.

Second It is my wish that my daughter Martha may have until her marriage all the social advantages that my fortune and circumstances will permit.

Third I give to my wife Ella my Chamber furniture including the Physic Case; my carriage and horses, my plate and Silverware the Spanish opals in full of my plate

Fourth After my daughter ~~Martha~~ Martha receives her bequest to her, I wish my wife Ella to have the liberty of disposing of the rest of my property between my two children Taylor and Julia so as to equally divide between them leaving to herself at all times a sufficient support.

Fifth I hereby appoint my beloved wife Ella my Executor to this my last will and Testament with full power to her to sell my real and personal estate in any manner she may think fit. My two children Taylor and Julia I appoint to my wife's keeping and guardianship but that she will do the best for them both morally and morally that circumstances will permit.

Sixth In assigning to my daughter Martha the Marlborough tract of land and a portion of my plate and furniture in personal estate as may be agreed upon between her and my wife Ella.

paid out of my estate, the balance of Estate both real
& personal I wish to be equally divided among my
children Emmeline Johnson dec. Joseph A Pyries,
Louisa A Humphrey, Margaret Evans, William M
Pyries, Catherine & Mary Honey D Pyries, Martha G
Pyries. My tract of land called Evans to be sold at 12
months credit (it contains 80 acres more or less) the
proceeds equally divided among the above named
children. My Silverware, household and kitchen
furniture to be sold as my executor may direct and
equally divided among my legatee. I appoint
Samuel S. Sylva and Mary Mann executors
to this my last Will and Testament given under
my hand and seal this 20th day of November in
the year of our Lord 1867.
