of Virginia. After paying my just and lawful
debts do make the following disposition of what
may be left. My Soul I trust to God; my body
to my mother Earth in a plain and decent coffin
to be made by Philip Skelton, and to be buried
wherever the majority of the family think best.
The rest of my property consisting of a house
3 Cattle, and the Corn on hand, and the grow-
ing crop of wheat and oats I give to my wife
Mary Jane Berkeley. My farm as it stands in-
cluding the buildings to be held by her during
life together with lumber, horse axe, plow and
grain, wagon - After the said Mary Jane's
death, to revert to all the Children equally.
